#### **Patient Accommodation and Travel Schemes**

### **NSW Taxi Transport Subsidy Scheme**

The NSW Taxi Transport Subsidy Scheme [TTSS]. Introduced in 1981 to assist residents of NSW who are unable to use public transport because of a qualifying severe and permanent disability; subsidises the travel cost of TTSS participants, allowing them to travel by taxi at half fare. The maximum subsidy that can be claimed is \$30.00.

Is not means tested, however, applicants must meet strict eligibility criteria. Receipt of an aged, invalid, blind or any other pension will not automatically qualify an individual for participation in the Scheme. Pre-school aged children, regardless of their disability, are ineligible for the Scheme.

#### The Mobility Parking Scheme - NSW

The Mobility Parking Scheme (MPS) provides parking concessions to people with mobility disabilities.

All applications for new or renewal MPS cards must be signed by a medical doctor. Doctors are aware that the fraudulent use of MPS cards disadvantage the people the scheme is designed to help, and will not sign the medical certificate unless you genuinely meet the requirements.

The RTA issues a licence-style card that includes the cardholders photograph, and other security features such as a hologram and a 'ghost' photo image. Proof of identity is required to ensure only eligible people receive a card.
